


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WINCHESTER MYSTERY HOUSE KICKS OFF THE HOLIDAY SEASON ON FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 13TH

Since tours began in 1923, more than 13 million people from around the world have toured the lonely hallways, dark passages and ornate rooms of the Winchester Mystery House.
